2.A Proposed Update to Tobacco Ordinance Presentation

Brea Hamdorf, H&HS Public Health Nurse presented to the board the proposed updates to the Tobacco Ordinance. Presentation included:

- Rural communities are disproportionately affected by tobacco use
- Behavioral Health and tobacco use
- 2020 Minnesota Youth Tobacco Survey
- Sharp increase in youth vaping across all grades: MN data
- Aitkin County Minnesota Student Survey Data
- The problem:

- Flavors hook kids
 - Menthol is a "flavored product"
- o Commercial tobacco disproportionately harms youth
- Tobacco 21 (MN Stat. 609.685)
- Underage PUP penalties removed from state law
- Regulations of the sale of tobacco products in Aitkin County
 - Current ordinance last amended and adopted 2006
 - Proposed Revised Ordinance
- Several jurisdictions already have restrictions on the sale of flavored tobacco products
- The impact of restricting the sale of flavored tobacco on the community
- Economic effects of sales and flavor restrictions on retailers

2.B Request to set Public Hearing Date for updated Tobacco Ordinance

The Board of Commissioners would like to have the Proposed Updates to the Tobacco Ordinance brought to the Ordinance Committee for approval. The request to set a Public Hearing date has been deferred until after Ordinance Committee meets on said subject.
