The Aitkin County Board of Commissioners met this 25th day of June 2024, at 9:05 a.m. as the Aitkin County Health & Human Services Board with the following members present: Board Chair, Commissioner J. Mark Wedel, Commissioners Laurie Westerlund, Travis Leiviska, Bret Sample and Michael Kearney. County Administrator Jessica Seibert and Health & Human Services Director Sarah Pratt. Others present included: H&HS Supervisor Erin Melz, Stacey Durgin-Smith HHS Public Health Educator, ACHHS Advisory Committee member representative Cindy Chuhanic, Jeanne Schram Aitkin Age, and other public quests.

1.A Approval of the Agenda

1.B Approval of the May 28, 2024 Minutes

1.C Approval of Bills

1.D Approval of Advisory Committee Appointment

2.A Director Updates

Sarah Pratt, H&HS Director updated the board on the following:

- 2023 End of Year Report
 - o Shared 2021 End of Year Report to show comparison
 - o Plan to create this End of Year Report annually
 - Highlighted the changes from 2021 to 2023
- Legislative Updates
 - \$10million for SSIS but a complete replacement would be between \$80-100million
 - o African American Preservation Act in affect in 2025 for only Ramsey and

Hennepin Counties, they received \$5million for the pilot project. The rest of the state will role out in 2027. This is protecting the best interest of African American children and it will look very different for our Child Protection staff. They will have to provide active efforts versus reasonable efforts and there will be an increase in the number of services we will need to provide. It will cause extra work for our staff and it could affect 80% of our cases.

- MNChoices Assessments Extends the validity of the assessment from 60 to 365, we wouldn't have to redo assessments as often. Increase initial contact from 20 calendar days to 20 working days which will help our assessors. We did not get the simplified reassessment that we wanted but there will be ongoing discussion this next session regarding that.
- Federal 1115 Medicaid Waiver, there will be some pilots offered across the state, we are hoping that the Region V+ Adult Mental Health Initiatives will be one of those pilots.
- CaseWorks The new EDMS, we are working with Financial and Child Support and
 rolling that out and they will go live the end of September. Social Services will start the
 planning process this week and they will go live the end of October. By the end of year,
 we will have our new system up and running and hopefully start to see the efficiencies
 that will bring.
- Staffing updates Child protection staff came on board. We hired a replacement for our HCBS position and are hiring for a new HCBS position.
