In FY2023, the child support program collected \$29.6 billion



**73%** of child support was collected by income withholding from an employee's paycheck (27% other sources)



97% of child support collected went to families (3% reimbursed public assistance dollars)



### COST-EFFECTIVENESS

One of the most cost-effective government programs

\$4.37

collected by the child support program for every \$1.00 spent



HOW IT HELPS PARENTS

### Automated

Payments can be automatically taken from the parent's paycheck instead of making manual payments.



### Neutral party

The child support program sets the amount based on income and other guidelines so the payment is fair.



### Accurate recordkeeping

The program keeps records of every payment.
